#### **100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Weekend**

Frank Lyon purchased the real estate where Lyon Village is located and started developing homes here in 1923. In celebration of this big milestone, we are having the following events the weekend of October 27 and 28.

#### Friday, October 27: Square Dance

Through the years, dancing was an important Lyon Village social activity. To celebrate this historic social pastime, on Friday night we will have a square dance at the Community House. Joining us will be square dance callers Nelson Wakeman and Tom Hughes. They are long time square dance callers in the Shenandoah Valley. #### Free Trees Available

**Eco-Action:** These are free professionally planted trees through Eco-Action, funded through fees to developers who remove trees. There are both Fall and Spring order and planting schedules. If you are interested in a free, professionally planted canopy tree this Spring, send an email to <u>ITS@mtnZephyr.com</u> with your name, email, and street address up now for Free Canopy Trees in Spring. The spring planting list will be out soon, and we already know that it will include the white oak species that is throughout LVCA and in need of replacement from loss due to age and the recent storms.

Our Fall-planted trees are coming this month. Those who
ordered trees through our group application should all
have received a notice that our application was accepted,
and that they will be soon receive stakes to mark their
previously identified planting spot. Our trees will be
coming in in the next few weeks!!

County provided free Trees for Private Property: This is

an annual program that has both Spring and Fall pick up times. You order, and then pick up and plant the trees when they are available. The application period is generally in September. In addition to canopy trees, this tree selection **now** includes popular understory trees and flowering trees such as Crepe Myrtle and Dogwood. These are first come, first served based on availability.

 Let's start planning our requests now for fall application. If you'd like to make a request for this annual program, reach out to John Carten who will send you the link.

Street Trees and trees for public spaces: This is an annual program. Ordering is always open, but County planting follows a spring and fall schedule. Generally, orders for spring planting are by the end of September and for fall by the end of June. The County provides and plants the trees for public spaces including "street trees" for right of way between curb and sidewalk and trees for other public spaces such as parks and medians. ## LVCA Neighbors Seek Contributions to Fight High Density Rezoning Within Lyon Village

A group of our Lyon Village neighbors adjacent to the Clarendon Presbyterian Church are seeking contributions from their neighbors in Lyon Village to fight a proposed land use change and rezoning being proposed for the church site that would allow a six-story residential building on the church site within Lyon Village. If approved, the land use change and rezoning on the church site would likely set a precedent for granting similar requests in Lyon Village and other single-family neighborhoods in Arlington. The precedent would be for *any* site of about a half-acre or more—not specific to church sites.

The neighbors have hired an attorney to guide them in opposing the land use and zoning changes and, while they have raised some part of the needed funds, they are seeking added contributions both from neighbors in the rest of Lyon Village and in other parts of Arlington for whom the land use and zoning changes here would serve as a precedent.

# National Pedestrian Safety Month

October is National Pedestrian Safety Month, and the Arlington County Police are teaming up with the Virginia Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) and the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) to share critical information about pedestrian safety.

#### **Drivers** are reminded to:

• Follow the speed limit and always remain alert, especially around school zones and in neighborhoods where children are present.

- Remember that holding a hand-held communication
- device while driving is illegal in Virginia.

• Be extra cautious when driving in hard-to-see conditions, such as nighttime or bad weather.

• Yield to pedestrians in crosswalks and stop well back from the crosswalk to give other vehicles an opportunity to see the crossing pedestrian.

#### **Pedestrians** are reminded to:

• Look before crossing the street and, whenever possible, cross at marked crosswalks.

- Remain alert at all times; do not be distracted by
- electronic devices that take your eyes off the road.
- Remain visible at all times, especially after dark.
