**Sidewalk access:** Now that the growing season is ending, please remember to trim your hedges and bushes back from the sidewalks. It's amazing how quickly a bush can narrow a sidewalk especially when rain and snow bend down the branches. Please preserve one of the most "walkable" communities in the country.

**Dogs:** Please remember your legal duties as a dog

- When outside, always keep your dog under your control on a leash (Arlington Code 2-5(A)) (except at the county dog park).
- Always clean up after your pet (even if walking at night or down back alleys) (Arl. Code2-5(B)).
- Do not let your dog bark for more than a few minutes inside or out (if the sound crosses your property lines) (Arl. Code 15-7).

# Remembering Ditty Boaz

Long-time Lyon Village resident Carolyn "Ditty" Boaz passed away on September 21 at Sunrise Assisted Living in Arlington. Ditty first moved to LV in 1976. She was soon elected **Historian of the Lyon Village Citizens Association**, the longest serving person to ever hold that position. In this role, she provided the neighborhood with a wealth of information, including a map of Lyon Village that was the centerfold of the *Directory* for many years. She maintained an extensive collection of pictures and documents about LV and made some fascinating presentations at the Community House. Ditty was also a member of the Arlington Historical Society. She was very active in the League of Women Voters, hosting meetings in her home every Saturday morning.
