LVCA General Meeting November 9, 8pm

Come join us to hear from and ask questions of Tom Hutchings, the Capital Projects Manager with the county's Department of Transportation, about the pending reconstruction of Clarendon Circle (the intersection of Washington, Clarendon and Wilson Boulevards), the final phases of the 13th Street reconstruction, and curb extensions at Wilson Blvd. and Hudson Street.

Our next General Meeting will be on March 14, but the *Bulletin* will be published monthly with the usual online updates between now and then. For the March meeting, we have tentatively scheduled a representative from Car2Go, the new car-share service in Arlington that is conducting an 18-month pilot program. Unlike Zip Car, Car2Go allows one-way use and pick-up and drop-off at any legal parking spot in the county, including metered spaces and neighborhood residential-district spaces. Cars picked up in Arlington must be returned to Arlington (DC Car2Go cars cannot be dropped off in Arlington and vice-versa).

Development Update

2401 Wilson – Hyatt Place Hotel. Construction is moving ahead rapidly with exterior walls being installed. The developer has created a web site at www.2401wilson.com and installed a web-based camera on the roof of the Navy League building that takes a still photo every 30 minutes to document the progress of construction, <http://www.workzonecam.com/projects/2401wilson>.

2401 Wilson – BeaconCrest Homes. Demolition and construction will begin later this year to replace the four houses behind the building on 16th St. with four new homes. Completion is expected by the end of 2016.

Red Top Cab development. A final meeting before the Planning Commission is scheduled for November 4, followed by County Board consideration on November 14.

Verde Pointe – Bergmann's Cleaners Site. The MOM's food market will have its soft opening during a ribbon-cutting ceremony, Thursday, November 12 at 11:30am.

Power Outages? Call Dominion.

Although last month's hurricane veered out to sea, there are nor'easters and snowstorms to come and our neighborhood will have power outages. When your power goes out, call Dominion Power at 866-366-4357. Please do this even if the outage is widespread and you figure your neighbors have already called! This will help Dominion determine the extent of the outage and help it set priorities for repairs. The larger the outage, the higher the priority will be for restoring power.

Fixing Our Streetlights

Planning Lee Highway's Future, Nov. 7 and 8

The Lee Highway Alliance is holding a charette on the future of Lee Highway from Rosslyn to Falls Church. It is open to all residents and will seek ideas on how the roadway should look and what uses should be sought out and allowed along it. Redevelopment is coming to the corridor and this is our opportunity to weigh in on how that development will relate to our neighborhood. The sessions are scheduled for the weekend of November 7 and 8 at the Langston-Brown Community Center (across from Heidelberg Bakery).
