WERA-LP 96.7 Meeting, May 10

A WERA FM Producer's Group meeting will be held on May 10 from 7:00-9:00pm in the large classroom at Arlington Independent Media, 2701-C Wilson Blvd. This will be a chance for you to: Meet other WERA radio producers or aspiring producers and other interested parties; hear stories about their radio programs or ideas for programs; and learn about what it takes to produce an ongoing radio show, one-time program, or series. WERA's 3.5-mile broadcast radius from the tower site at 2300 Clarendon Boulevard reaches a potential audience of 700,000 people, including all of Arlington County, parts of the surrounding Northern Virginia region, and even the White House in DC.

Development Update

2401 Wilson – Hyatt Place Hotel. Construction continues with walls being completed and interior work continuing. The website www.2401wilson.com shows a still photo of the project every 30 minutes from a webbased camera on the roof of the Navy League, http://www.workzonecam.com/projects/2401wilson.

2401 Wilson – BeaconCrest Homes. Foundations are complete and framing is well underway for the four new homes on 16th Street behind the hotel. Completion is expected by the end of 2016.

Red Top Cab development. Still no word on a construction start date for the block bordered by 13th St. N, Washington Blvd., and the Beacon apartment building. Construction impact meetings between the contractor and LVCA need to be held prior to the start of any work.

Stay Informed

There are a number of ways to stay informed about what is going on in Lyon Village and Arlington.

If you do not receive periodic email updates from us, you are missing out. Our *Lyon Village ListServ* sends timely information about crime, power outages, street closures, the occasional lost pet, and more. Sign up on our website, www.lyonvillage.org, or encourage new neighbors and reluctant technophobes to sign up! This update typically comes out once a week on Fridays.

Another source is Next Door Lyon Village, which is used by neighbors and others (Arlington County Police) to highlight events and information in and around the neighborhood. Go to Nextdoor@nextdoor.com to sign up.

Finally, get daily emails each afternoon from Arlington Now about important events, news or information about Arlington. Go to Arlington Now.com to sign up.

Yard Waste FAQs

Which cart do I use? The green cart is for yard waste, the blue is for recycling and the black is for trash.

When is yard waste collected? The new year-round yard waste service is collected on the same day as your trash and recycling.

How should I put yard waste in the cart? You can dump yard waste directly into the cart or use biodegradable paper bags. We cannot collect yard waste that has been placed in plastic bags (both in and outside the cart). Please refrain from using plastic bags in your yard waste carts or your recycling carts.

What about dirt? If you have a small amount of dirt, it's okay to place it in your yard waste cart. However, large amounts require special disposal methods due to weight. We can collect carts that are filled 1/3 or less with dirt. If your cart is filled more than 1/3 with dirt, it will be too heavy to collect.

But I have a lot of dirt. How do I get rid of it? To dispose of a truckload of dirt, schedule an appointment at the Solid Waste Bureau by calling 703-228-6570. You can dispose of one truck full each month.

What about lumber? Place lumber with the black trash cart, not the green yard waste cart. Lumber needs additional preparation, so please check out our recommendations for preparing to dispose of it. For our crew's safety, please bend down any nails, cut into four feet lengths and bundle together in sections under 50 pounds.

What should I tell my landscaper/lawn service?

Please communicate to your landscaper/lawn service. The use of plastic bags is prohibited. Plastic bags are not compostable and may hide hazards which can injure collection crews or contaminate the mulch and compost products made from yard waste.

Please Don't Recycle Plastic Bags

"In the past, our recycling processor allowed county recycling customers to put plastic bags in their recycling carts," Erik Grabowsky, Arlington's Solid Waste Bureau Chief, tells ARLnow.com. "However, the processor cannot accept these plastic bags anymore because they wrap around processing equipment and disrupt operations. We ask that residents stop putting plastic bags in their recycling carts."

Please refrain from including plastic bags of any kind in your recycling cart.
