2nd Diener Killer Convicted

The jury that convicted 25-year-old Javon Martin of robbery and first-degree felony murder Jan. 5 for the stabbing of LV resident Carl Diener recommended that Martin receive a 27-year sentence, the *Arlington Now* website reported.

The jury had the option of recommending sentences up to life in prison for Martin. He is expected to be formally sentenced before Judge Louise DiMatteo in May.

Martin's cousin and co-defendant, Roger Clark III, pleaded guilty to Diener's murder last year and will be sentenced at some point in the future. The maximum sentence Clark could receive is 25 years in prison; he was offered a reduced sentence as part of a plea deal for testifying against Martin.

LV Community House

We will begin with Captain Penn of the Arlington County police giving us an update of police incidents in and around Clarendon and Lyon Village. We will also be honoring District 2 team member Sergeant Charlene Lancaster who is retiring from the police force after a long and distinguished career. Sgt. Lancaster has worked closely with us on many Lyon Village police issues over the years to safeguard our community. She always did a great job arranging for and overseeing the police detail for our annual Fourth of July parade as well other special events. She got to know us well and was always wonderfully responsive. We'll miss her!

Executive Committee member Miles Mason then will give us an update on the Arlington Public Schools process for redistricting the elementary schools. In order to address overcrowding, APS is building new elementary schools and additions to existing schools, changes that will require boundary changes. Last fall APS initiated a process to develop boundaries for a new elementary school at Williamsburg. As part of this process, APS has engaged the community in a number of community meetings as well as online surveys. We will provide updates on the process and let you know how you can get involved. Development Update

2311 Wilson Blvd. (Listrani's pizza site). The Site Plan Review Committee meeting to consider designs for the relocated pedestrian path that currently bisects the site has not yet been scheduled. That pathway is popular with the neighborhood, with over 1,000 users per day.

2401 Wilson Blvd. A developer has filed a site plan for a hotel and four single-family houses at Adams St. and Wilson Blvd. A series of Site Plan Committee meetings are to be scheduled for late winter/spring.

Zom. Pouring for the foundation has begun for this retail/residential project at Washington Blvd. and Ivy St. Two construction cranes have been erected.

Lee Highway and Veitch St. townhouses. The final section of townhouses on this site is complete, with one unit remaining to be sold.

Washington Blvd. and Highland Street.

Concrete continues to be poured for the foundation and garage levels.

James Hunter Park ("the dog park").

Construction continues at 13th and Herndon Streets.

Clarendon Metro Plaza. The final new paving tiles in the reconfigured plaza are being installed at Highland and Wilson. Once this work is complete, repaving of the rest of the park to the war memorial will commence.

History

Most of Lyon Village was originally part of Robert Cruit's estate, which was purchased in 1.846 and 1.847 as a weekend and holiday retreat and later used as a dairy farm. The property was purchased by Frank Lyon on June 2.6, 1923 and divided into lots for real estate development. Approximately thirty-seven percent of the existing homes in Lyon Village were built in the 1920's, andthe thirty-six percent in the 1930's, and the remainder since 1940. The neighborhood is listed in the National Register of Historic Places.

Fiber Optic Coming

This spring, the county will construct a fiber optic network, called ConnectArlington, to connect County government and public school buildings and traffic signals throughout the county. Underground and aerial work will affect streets near Science Focus School, Key School, and the Thurgood Marshall Building from mid-February to April.

Door hangers will be distributed to affected homes seven days before work begins. County staff will be closely monitoring the work at each site and at least one contractor vehicle at every site will be displaying ConnectArlington placards.
