#### **Development Update**

2301 Wilson Blvd: All tenants have left; the building will be demo'd and the site cleared this fall (the small park will remain). Construction will not start until 2015.

2401 Wilson Blvd: The first stage of construction will be the installation of new water, gas, and electric lines under North Adams Street, which could commence in September, with demolition of the existing building to follow in October. The hotel is expected to be ready for guests in early spring of 2016.

**ZOM:** The ZOM project on the west side of N. Irving Street at 13th Street is nearing completion. The rebuild of N. Irving Street is complete and open to traffic. The six-story building is complete, as is the lobby thru the 4th floor at the High Rise. Final completion will be later this fall.
