Zoned Parking Survey

Results of a recent LVCA survey indicate strong support for Zoned Parking by those who have it, and a desire to get it by those who do not have it. LVCA President John Carten has sent the 3-page survey summary and a 9-page detailed version to county staff, who are reviewing the purpose and function of Zoned Parking.

The LVCA Executive Committee is concerned that new multi-family buildings are being built with inadequate parking that will result in spillover parking, thus increasing the importance of Zoned Parking. Click here to read a 3-page summary of the results.

LVCA Meeting, March 11 8pm, Community House

Lyon Village Citizens Association meeting will be Monday, March 11 at 8:00pm at the Community House. The meeting features two sessions:

Board member Katie Cristol will talk about recent developments in the county, including the proposed budget for next year and the Amazon project, and answer questions from the audience.

The Arlington Police will present the Arlington Restaurant Initiative, which is designed to reduce alcohol-related harm by building trusting relationships between the police and restaurant owners, managers and staff. The initiative started in Clarendon and has now expanded throughout the county. A total of 20 restaurants are accredited and display an accredited sticker on their door. These restaurants have written policies and the employees have received training on safe practices such as fake identification detection, over-serving, bar bystander sexual assault intervention, and deescalation. In addition, the Police Nightlife Detail is expanding. There are now 10 officers stationed in Clarendon and two officers stationed in the Ballston Quarter between 9pm and 3am on Friday and Saturday nights. The ACPD Restaurant Liaison Unit has seen a drastic decline in alcohol-related violence in Arlington and continues to address quality of life issues related to alcohol-related incidents. It Takes a Village

Recent events have shown us how important it is to keep in touch with the elderly in our community, many of whom would benefit from a daily check on how they are doing. "How can I help without intruding on people's privacy?" Some answers are: Get to know your neighbors. Share what you learn with others. Don't be afraid to take the first step. (You'll probably make a new friend.) Keep your eyes and ears open to those around you. Shovel their walk during a storm or offer to get some things from the grocery store for them.

Pedestrian Safety Tips

Look both ways before stepping off a curb. Cross a street in a designated crosswalk; (Arlington County Police Department statistics reveal that 73 percent of all pedestrians injured in the County were not in a crosswalk when injured.) If there's no sidewalk, always walk facing oncoming traffic. If walking at night, wear light-colored clothing or reflective tape so you're more visible to drivers. Be aware that drivers may be blinded by sunlight or by the headlights of oncoming traffic. Never assume that a driver sees you!

When walking with children, always grasp their hands firmly to ensure they don't break away and dart into traffic. If you're not sure you have enough time to get across the street before the light changes, wait for a "fresh" green light or walk signal, as it will give you the most time to cross. Be considerate of the driver who has complied with the law and yielded the right-of-way. Cross the street as expeditiously as possible. The "Golden Rule" is most appropriate: Do unto others as you would have them do unto you.

Driver Safety Reminders

We love our walkable neighborhood and we want to make sure it is safe for all who live and travel within it. Drivers are reminded to always be alert:

- Come to a FULL stop at all stop signs. Let pedestrians, cyclist and vehicles pass until safe to proceed
- ALWAYS watch for people walking, biking and children playing
- When parking, DO NOT BLOCK any portion of a sidewalk or crosswalk
- STOP for all school buses with stop sign extended.
- Drive with caution at or below the posted speed limit
- Slow down as conditions warrant rain, snow, sun glare, dusk, etc.

1122 N. Kirkwood Road Development

Eleventh Street Development is working on plans to build a seven-story apartment building on a 1.7-acre property located at 1122 N. Kirkwood Road, near the road's intersection with Washington Blvd. Eleventh Street is planning to add 255 one-and two-bedroom apartments to the site, complete with two floors of underground parking (190 spaces). Three businesses on the property will be displaced: Zolly Foreign Car Specialists, a State Farm insurance office, and Slye Digital Media Systems. An initial site plan meeting was held in February and a second meeting is planned for early March. LVCA has a seat at the Site Plan meetings to express our concerns about the project.

When There Is Bad Weather

Please see that your sidewalks get shoveled as soon as possible after the snow. Also be sure to shovel out the fire hydrants near your house. For people who have water draining on their sidewalk, please put out sand or salt to make the surface less slippery.
